FACT SHEET

LOCATION

Mt. Spokane Ski & Snowboard Park is located 23 miles north of Spokane, Wash.

MOUNTAIN FACTS

- *Winter season:* Late November to early April
- *Hours of operation:* December 1 - March 31st weather permitting
Wed - Sun 9am - 4pm
Night Skiing Wed. – Sat., December 8th - Feb 24th
- *Average annual snowfall:* 300 inches
- *Elevation:* Lowest base elevation: 4,200 feet
Highest top elevation: 5,889 feet
Longest vertical drop: 2,000 feet
- *Lifts:* Double chairlifts: 5
- *Average annual visits:* 95,000
- *Trails:* 45
- *Terrain parks:* Mt. Spokane offers a newly expanded terrain park encompassing more than 25 acres and 1,200 vertical feet. Features include new and expanded rails, fun boxes and rollers, new signs and outdoor music.

YOUTH AND EDUCATION PROGRAMS

- Mt. Spokane offers a variety of three- and six-week programs for skiers and boarders ages three to 15. Three-week sessions begin the first weekend in December and six-week programs begin the second weekend in January. Upon completion of two three-week programs or one six-week program, students receive a complimentary season pass for the remainder of the season. Three-week programs are also available for adults 16 and older.
- Ladies Day Program: Beginning in January, on the second Wednesday of the month, instruction is available in small groups by Mt. Spokane's top female instructors. Lunch, video analysis and review, as well as wine, cheese and massage.

LODGING

Accommodations are available a short distance from Mt. Spokane at Bear Creek Lodge, www.bearcreeklodgewa.com.

AMENITIES

- The Vista House atop Mt. Spokane is a historical landmark offering a warm fire, hot soup, coffee, cocoa and light snack options throughout the winter.
- Cross country skiing and snowshoeing is available in the state park.

- The brush cutting crew has increased the width of several runs as well as increased visibility for tree skiing.

INTERESTING FACTS

- The original name of Mt. Spokane was Mt. Baldy; it was changed to Mt. Spokane in 1912.
- The historic landmark Vista House was built out of quartz in 1934. It sits at the top of Chair 1 and is open to skiers and snowboarders during the weekends throughout the ski season.
- The Mt. Spokane Ski Club built the world's first double chair lift at the ski area in 1946. The Riblet Aerial Tramway Company converted an ore carrier into the chair lift.
